Expanding Teams & Services

Seniors with Hope, a program designed to help seniors learn about lifestyle and medical topics at the Medical Plaza, is expanding as it celebrates its first anniversary.

HopeHealth partnered with Golden Life and the Florence Parks and Recreation Department in August 2017 to present the program which focuses on health, business, social, and saftey issues impacting Florence and Pee Dee area senior citizens. This August, HopeHealth will host its first Kingstree *Seniors with Hope* from 2-3:30 p.m., Aug. 23, in the Kingstree conference room with guest speakers **Bryan Simpson** and **Dr. Lisa Lanning**.

Simpson, a HopeHealth security officer, will discuss driving safety for seniors, and Dr. Lanning, a physician at the Medical Plaza, will address how to stay healthy in the heat. **Carl Humphries**, HopeHealth CEO, will also discuss community health centers.

Getting a Jump on Back to School

Before you know it, it will be time to register children for school. Schedule Well Child Visits early to ensure your children's vaccinations are up to date.

Vaccines protect you adn your family and help prevent the spread of diseases. Beyond protecting health, children with vaccine-preventable diseases can be denied attendence at schools and day-care facilities. School immunization requirements generally follow the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices guidelines.

In South Carolina, that means rising 7th graders are required to have received one dose of Tdap to protect against bacterial infections such as tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis (whooping cough). The meningococcal conjugate vaccine is also recommended for all children ages 11-12, with a booster dose at age 16, and the HPV vaccination is recommended beginning at age 11, with a booster dose in 6-12 months.

Teens and young adults (16-23 years) also may be vaccinated with a serogroup B meningococcal vaccine
