HopeHealth Recognized for Quality achievements

HopeHealth has been recognized by the Health Resources & Services Administration "for notable quality improvement achievements in the areas of access, quality, health equity, and health information technology" based on data from the 2020 calendar year.

HopeHealth was recognized and awarded community health center quality recognition badges in three areas:

Overall clinical quality measure performance - Silver



For achieving the best overall clinical quality measure performance among all health centers. Gold is the top 10 percent of all centers; silver, the top 11-20 percent; and bronze, the top 21-30 percent.

Advancing Health Information Technology for Quality (HIT)



Meet all criteria to optimize HIT services that advance telehealth, patient engagement, interoperability, and collection of social determinants of health to increase access to care and advance quality of care.

Patient Centered Medical Home Recognition



Achieve PCMH recognition in one or more delivery sites.

PCMH recognition patient treatment is coordinated through a primary care physician

to ensure the necessary care is provided when and where needed and in a manner the patient can understand. There are five core principles and functions provided by a PCMH:

- 1. comprehensive care
- 2. a patient-centered approach
- 3. coordinated care
- 4. accessibility of services
- 5. quality and safety

Community health centers annually report a core set of information, including data on patient characteristics, services provided, clinical processes, and health outcomes, patients' use of services, staffing, costs, and revenues as part of a standardized reporting system known as the UDS. Jett-Clair Named SC Coach of the Year

Sonda Jett-Clair of HopeHealth's Diabetes and Nutrition Institute team has been recognized by the South Carolina Public Health Association as the Lifestyle Change Coach of the Year. The award is presented by the South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control each year to an individual who has made special contributions in diabetes prevention and has proven results through program participants' weight loss.

Jett-Clair, chronic disease prevention coordinator at the HopeHealth Medical Plaza, received the recognition virtually during the 19th Annual Chronic Disease Prevention Symposium.

"Sonda is realistic and motivational at the same time, helping people meet goals and navigate challenges and options. She single-handedly helped get the Diabetes Prevention Program certified," said Anita Longan, diabetes center coordinator.

"Her friendly, engaging manner encourages her class participants to share their preferences, needs and values, which then helps them overcome unhealthy lifestyle habits," said Longan.

"When you know better, you can do better!" said Jett-Clair. "If I can reach one person, and motivate one individual who has pre-diabetes to make some lifestyle changes, then I feel like I have accomplished something. So I try to give people the tools so they can know better and make some changes."
