

Lake City School-Based Clinic

School is starting back, and HopeHealth is here to serve students with minimal school disruption! HopeHealth will be on campus in the Health Connections building on the Lake City High School campus every Tuesday and Thursday from 8:30 am to 3:00 pm.

Any student in District 3 may be seen at the school-based clinic. Included with a well-child visit, your child can get a sports physical for the school year, the required Tdap vaccination, and other CDC recommended immunizations! Staff can also see sick students, faculty and staff during these hours. Additionally, parents who are new to the area may be seen for an initial appointment, before being referred to another HopeHealth location for their follow-up.

Pick up a HopeHealth consent form and either return it to the school or bring it to the appointment to take advantage of these services. Walk-ins are welcome.
