**HopeHealth** has partnered with PDRTA, the Town of Timmonsville, and Florence County to expand transportation access and alleviate this barrier to care. From this partnership, a new transportation route was developed, entitled the **Timmonsville Express**, which aims to provide convenient, accessible transportation options for Timmonsville residents. The route, available on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays, includes 14 strategically located stops. In addition to enhancing local connectivity, PDRTA will establish a direct link between Timmonsville and Florence.
