6-12 & 13-18


### Prize:

# HopeHealth's Landrey Arnold Recognized at NACHC Conference



Landrey Arnold, patient care advocate (PCA) manager, presented at the National Association of Community Health Centers (NACHC) CHI Conference in San Diego, California. Landrey presented on how the HopeHealth PCA team is utilizing automated technology through the use of a letter bot they have dubbed "Lettie."

The PCA team previously generated every patient reminder letter by hand. This was a very time-consuming process, averaging about 6-8 minutes per letter, equivalent to the working time of three full-time employees. "Lettie" now develops and prints all reminder letters, allowing for same-day mailing which helps information reach patients sooner. Through the use of "Lettie," the PCA team has been able to spend more time developing workflows and scheduling more appointments for patients. This partnership has resulting in an improved working experience for the PCA team and better care outcomes.
