Monthly Quality Measures









HopeHealth utilizes monthly quality measures to help us focus on the most pressing health concerns for patients in our area. The clinical quality focuses for this quarter are:

December: HIV/AIDS

Measures include screening for HIV and informing patients about prevention and treatment options for HIV/AIDS (including PrEP and PEP).

January: Obesity

Measures include BMI screening, nutrition counseling, activity counseling, and maintaining healthy A1c levels.

February: Cardiovascular Health

Measures include controlling high blood pressure, aortic aneurysm screening, and utilizing statin medications.



The team of endocrinologists, nurse practitioner, registered nurses, certified diabetes educators, registered dieticians, care navigators, community health workers, and support staff works together to provide individualized care.

The Diabetes Institute incorporates educational opportunities to help empower each patient to manage their diabetes. Free community class offerings for this year include Food4Health (basic nutrition), Cook4health (cooking courses), Diabetes Talk, Food Talk, and walking group classes.

In addition to providing comprehensive care for diabetes, HopeHealth's fellowship-trained endocrinologists assess and provide treatment for the full spectrum of medical conditions associated with the endocrine system.
